Spellings to be learnt for a test on Monday.

Spelling rule = '-ably' and '-ibly'

Sometimes words ending in '-ably' and '-ibly' sound similar, but are spelt differently e.g. understandably and possibly.

The '-ably' ending is usually used when a complete root word can be heard before it e.g. comfortably. In 'comfortably', you can hear the complete root word 'comfort'.

The '-ibly' ending is usually used when a complete root word can't be heard before it e.g. incredibly. In 'incredibly', 'incred' is not a complete root word.

'-ably' favourably irresistibly regrettably acceptably remarkably justifiably respectably recognisably tolerably debatably	'-ible' terribly visibly sensibly impossibly legibly
