This week we have been revising using apostrophes to show when something belongs to someone. This is called possession. When we need to say that something belongs to something singular (one thing), we put an apostrophe and then an 's' at the end of the name it belongs to e.g. the man's bike.

Please dictate the following sentences to your child and encourage them to think about where the apostrophe needs to go. When they have finished their sentence, help them to check their spelling and their punctuation.

- 2. My sister's teddy has a beautiful pink bow.
- 3. Amy Johnson's plane was called Jason.
- 4. Jason's tail broke in a storm.
- 5. Would you like a piece of Bob's chocolate cake?
- 6. The dog's teeth were very sharp.
