Physical Education and Sport nurtures and celebrates individual talents and strengths, as well as developing perseverance and teamwork, which leads to improved confidence, focus and academic achievement.

School Sport Premium Funding

The government is providing additional funding of £150 million per annum for academic years 2013 to 2014 and 2014 to 2015 to improve provision of physical education (P.E.) and sport in primary schools. This funding – provided jointly by the Departments of Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport – has been allocated to primary school head teachers.

This funding is ring-fenced and therefore can only be spent on provision of P.E. and sport in schools.
